- On September 2-26, OSHP held a "Sleepers in September" drive for Edmond Chapter of Newborns in Need. They collected 15 sleepers, 6 blankets, 12 packages of wipes, 12 packages of diapers, and some bibs and clothes. Newborns in Need provides necessities to agencies and hospitals serving premature, ill, or impoverished newborns. It distributes items free of charge to babies in the United States.
- In September, the Delta Beta chapter of Kappa Psi at SWOSU donated \$5,000.00 to St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. This donation was made in memory of Rusty Hartsell.
- On September 18<sup>th</sup>, the Fellowship of Christian Pharmacists (FCP) held a "Sole Hope Shoe Cutting Party" to cut out shoes. Those cut outs were sent to Uganda where local cobblers, who will be paid a fair wage, will assemble the shoes. The shoes are then provided to locals who frequently go without shoes and end up contracting jiggers, a parasite that grows in the foot and, in some cases, limits the ability to walk. FCP worked with Sole Hope, an organization which was founded for the purpose of providing healthy feet options for those in need in Uganda. Also, FCP donated \$50 to help with the expense of transporting the shoe parts to Uganda and paying the salary of the cobbler.
- On October 28<sup>th</sup>, APhA-ASP chapter hosted guest speaker Dr. Rebecca Segrest from Cardinal Health. She spoke about her career and experience as a Nuclear Pharmacist.
- In October, founding member and SWOSU 1991 pharmacy graduate, Stacy Cody traveled from his home in Sulphur Springs, Texas, to speak to the Fellowship of Christian Pharmacists (FCP). Cody is active in a local church and gives of himself in his professional capacity through mission opportunities in foreign countries, such a Nicaragua. His life story was inspirational and certainly spoke to the need of incorporating one's faith into a professional career.
- The local ASHP Clinical Skills Competition was held on October 21<sup>st</sup>. The winning team was P. Kim Abbott and Morgan Greutman and they will receive a "most-expenses" paid trip to Anaheim, CA, to compete on the national level at the ASHP Midyear Clinical Meeting in December.
- The annual Agape fundraising luncheon was held on Sunday, November 16th at the Weatherford Pioneer Center. \$11,000 was raised by the Weatherford community for the Agape Medical Clinic. Many COP faculty, staff and students served as volunteers.
- On November 17<sup>th</sup>, Oklahoma Pharmacist Helping Pharmacist (OPHP), Phi Lambda Sigma (PLS) and SWOSU COP hosted guest speaker Kevin McCauley, a nationally recognized physician on the science and psychology of addiction from the Institute for Addiction Study, for the PLS Chemical Dependency Seminar at SWOSU (organized by COP student Alex Foster).
- FCP collected and packed 43 boxes with toys, hygiene products, school supplies, and misc. accessories to send overseas to children around the world for Operation Christmas Child. Thanks to the generous help from COP students & faculty, and the Indian Pentecostal Church of OKC. After adding these boxes to Chi Alpha's donated boxes...a total of 77 boxes were sent.
- For the first time, SWOSU FCP sent three students, Ashley McMahon, Kortney Meyers, and Erin McGuire, to the Christian Pharmacists Fellowship International Annual Meeting in Myrtle Beach, South Carolina. At the conference this June, the students were able to connect with practicing pharmacists and other pharmacy students, develop their leadership traits, and collaborate with fellow pharmacy believers. This coming summer, FCP is looking forward to sending eight FCP students to the CPFI student retreat in Flat Rock, North Carolina.

### Profile of the Fall 2014 Class

From the 127 qualified applicants, 42 were selected. The fall 2014 class is 43% (18) male and 57% (24) female. The mean age is 22.28 years old. The fall 2014 class has a mean GPA of 3.56, a mean ACT of 26.73, and an average composite PCAT of 63.59%.
